

As my duties as your Bridge Pastor come to a close, I want to thank each of you for your support, warmth, and gracious spirit. Even though it has been a short time, I have enjoyed the ministry of Christ here at John Knox Presbyterian Church and will continue to pray that God pour out his love and blessings on each of you. I have been impressed with the commitment that each of you have expressed in your diligent service to this church, and to each other. I believe the Lord is pleased with your works of service to this community and generous giving over the years. You are truly blessed by God.

As you know, the demographics of Florissant have changed. In view of this change, I believe John Knox Presbyterian Church has the opportunity, in this transitional period, to be an example of what it means to show God's love across racial and class lines. Racism and classism have caused deep separation and emotional pain to many people here in St. Louis. Unfortunately, because of racial hate and disgust, there has been physical pain, even death, to many people of color. As Christians, the Holy Bible says we are all "One" in Christ. Yet, when it comes to actually living in that reality, we sometimes fall short as God's people. This shouldn't be. Why? Because we are counter-culture people. We are called to live counter to the world and the values of the world. Our world, and our culture, is the Kingdom of God. Christ is the King of this Kingdom. Our cultural (Kingdom) ethics are rooted in His teachings. At the center of His teachings is, "Love Thy Neighbor as Thyself". Who is our neighbor? According to Jesus, anyone in need of help (parable of the Good Samaritan). Color is not an issue in God's economy. Only the care of anyone who needs help. Will God help us live this way despite our upbringing? Of Course He will....if we actually "want" to live that way.

This Christian dilemma of moving toward better racial relations and sincere "colorless caring", reminds me of a song that became a best seller some years ago. The title of the song was; "What's Love Got to do with it" by Tina Turner. At the heart of our calling as Christians, love has to do with everything. Race, color, and class included. Thank God the Bible says, "For God So Loved The World that He gave His only Begotten Son"....It doesn't say "For God So Loved Black People or White People that He Gave His Only Begotten Son"... God So Loved Everyone that He Gave Jesus.

John Knox Presbyterian congregation has a great opportunity to express God's love by being intentional in becoming a diverse church that reaches out to the neighborhood, not taking into account color, status, or other social barriers, but only compassion for others.

Again, thank you for your warmth and kindness. You are God's light and salt in Florissant and beyond. Blessings and Peace Be With You.

means that sunrise and sunset will occur an hour earlier starting with Sunday.





During its June meeting, the PMA’s Mission Development Resources Committee also announced the approval of two \$25,000 investment grants given to worshipping communities living into their mission and ministry and two \$25,000 growth grants to “1001” communities growing into a viable Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) related community. (See Mission Yearbook, October 1, 2019 for complete details.)




